IN THE MEDIUM TERM PRIMARY NUMBERS WILL CONTINUE TO FALL.

FROM SEPTEMBER 2015 TO SEPTEMBER 2023 (DECEMBER 2022 FOR BIRTHS):

- Total primary pupils have decreased by 15%
- Reception pupils have decreased by 21%
- Births have decreased by 26%
- Reception applications have decreased by 22%

Some areas in Southwark, particularly "Borough & Bankside" and "Peckham & Nunhead," have seen an even sharper drop in primary demand.

UNDERSTANDING CHANGE IN OUR COMMUNITY



FEWER FAMILIES

Fewer families living in Nunhead and Peckham and lots of school places free



INCREASED NEEDS

Increased pupil needs and not enough places for children in specialist settings and schools with specialist settings



BUDGET DEFICIT

Space and staffing for 120/90 pupils but only attracting 60-65 children leaves a shortfall of income



OUR 2 SITES DESIGNED FOR A LARGER PUPIL BODY CANNOT BE FUNDED BY IVYDALE AS A MUCH SMALLER SCHOOL

ALL SCHOOLS RECEIVE £4610 MIN PER PUPIL PER ANNUM.

SO A SHORTFALL OF 30 PUPILS IS £138,300 PER YEAR GROUP PER YEAR OR £968K PER SCHOOL PER YEAR.

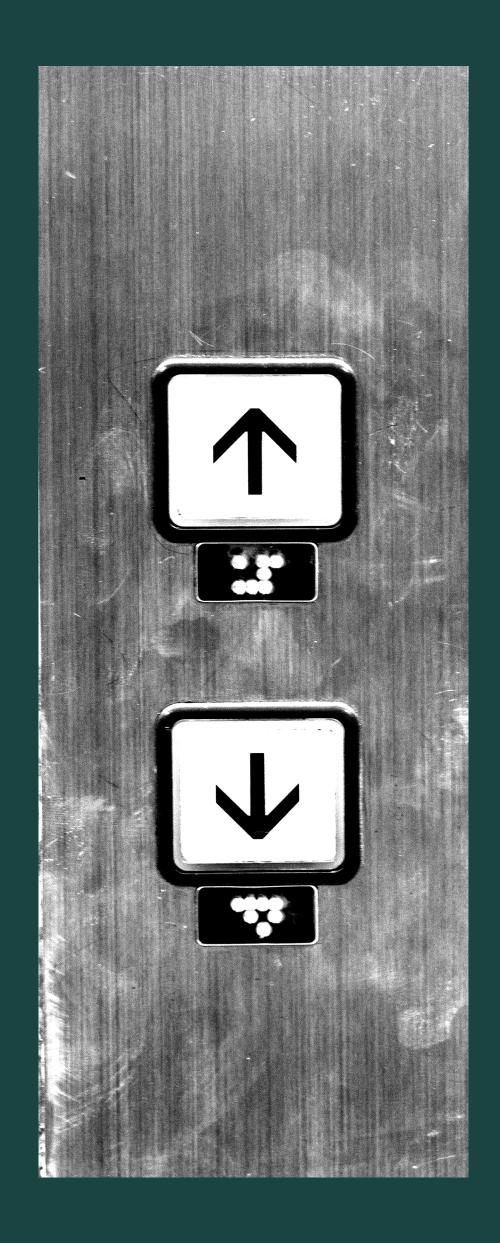
